



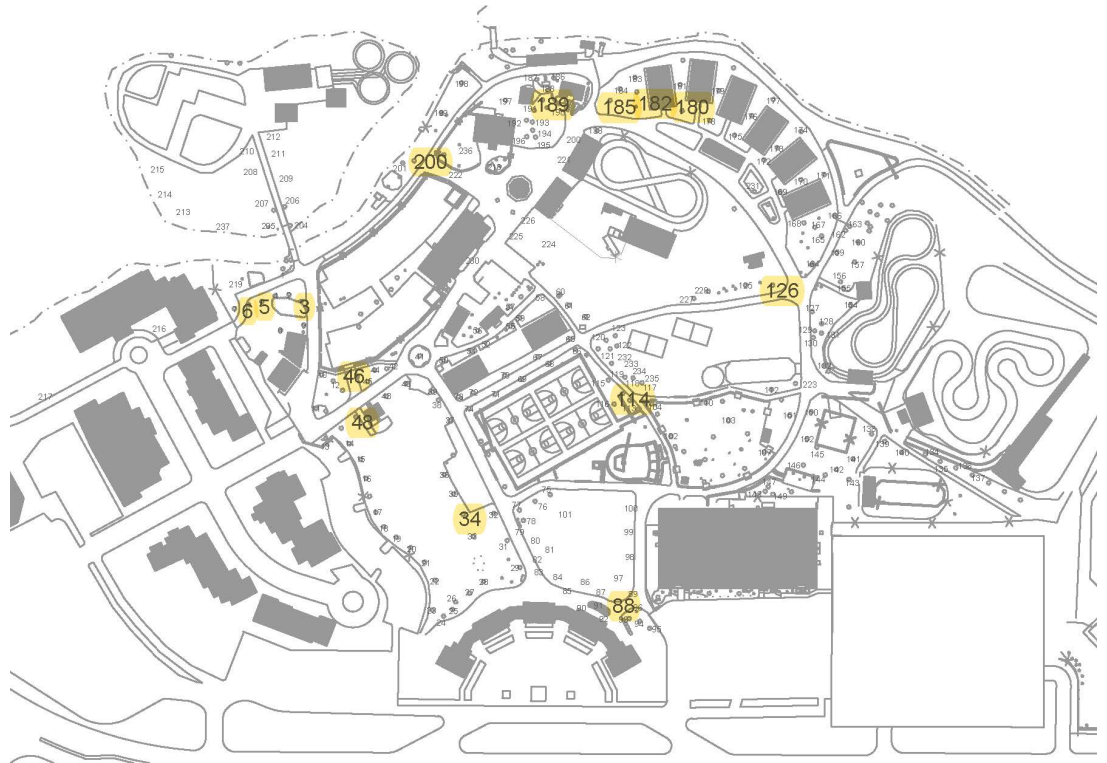

The Red Maple is a medium to fast-growing deciduous tree. Young trees are pyramidal or elliptical, becoming more rounded and irregular with age. Leaves have 3 or 5 lobes, with small teeth and reddish stems. Leaf buds are noticeably red in early Spring and leaves can turn brilliant red in Fall. Fruit is a winged samara. Red Maple is a popular landscape species with many cultivars.
