The Hackberry is a medium to fast-growing native tree with a medium-coarse texture. The medium-green leaves turn yellow-green in Fall. The gray bark has characteristic corky ridges. Orange-red-purple fruits are produced in Fall and are a treat for birds and wildlife.

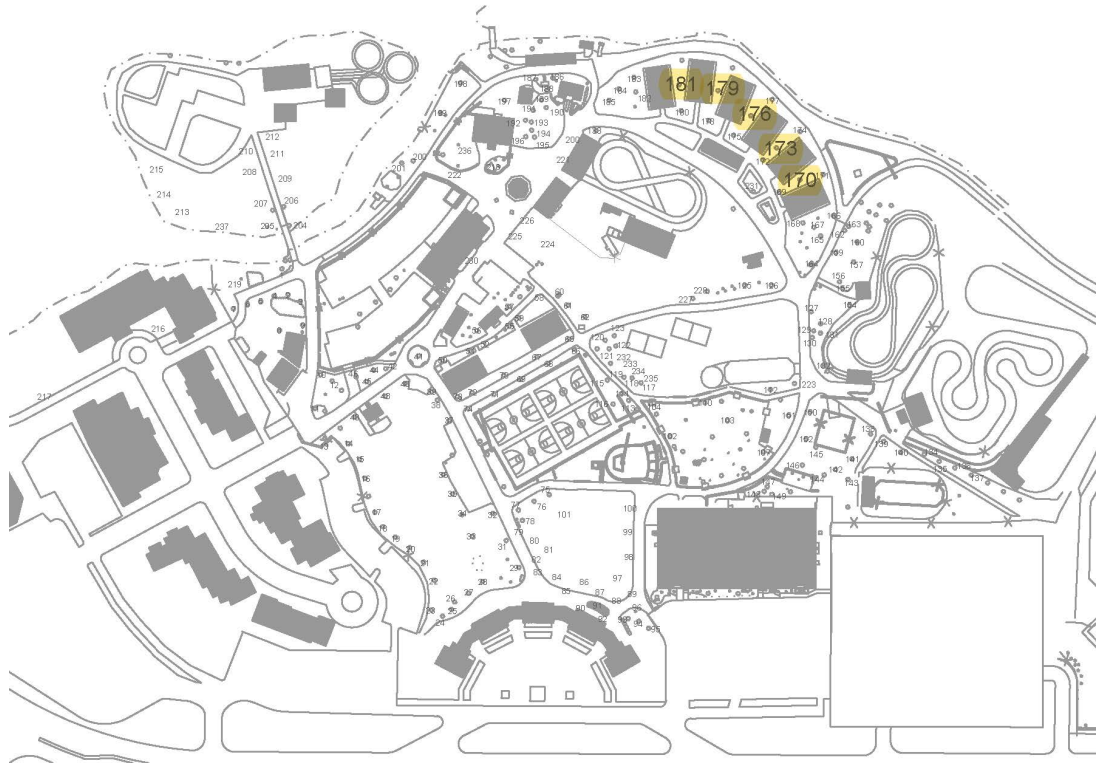
