



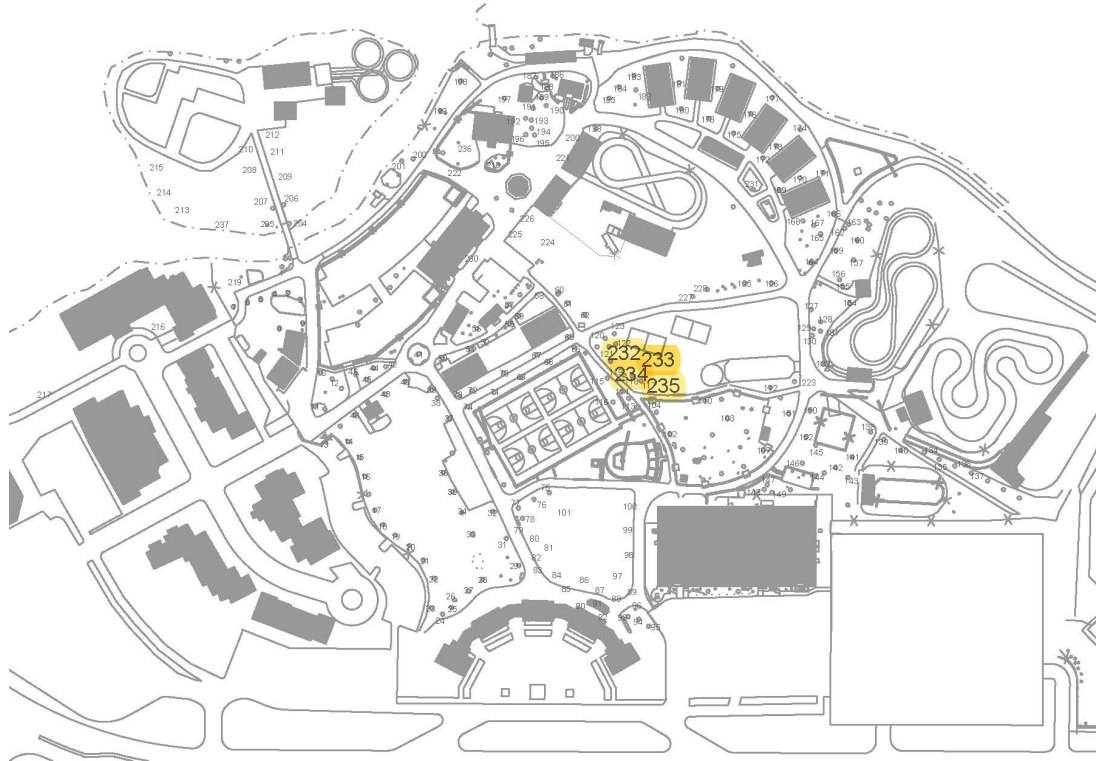

The Flowering Dogwood is a slow to medium-growing small tree. Habit is spreading, with low branches and horizontal lines. Leaves are oval, with a distinct point and parallel veins. Fall color is red-purple. Distinct bracts (not true flowers) open before the leaves and can be white or pink. Fruit is a small, glossy, red drupe that is often eaten by birds before they are noticeable.
