The Ginkgo is a slow to medium-growing, pyramidal to spreading tree with gray-brown furrowed bark. The bright green, fan-shaped leaves are quite distinctive and give the tree a coarse, but attractive appearance. Fall color is a stunning yellow. Female trees produce a tan-orange fruit that is round and fleshy, and produce a very unpleasant odor. For this reason, male selections are preferred for commercial use, but are difficult to identify until the tree matures.

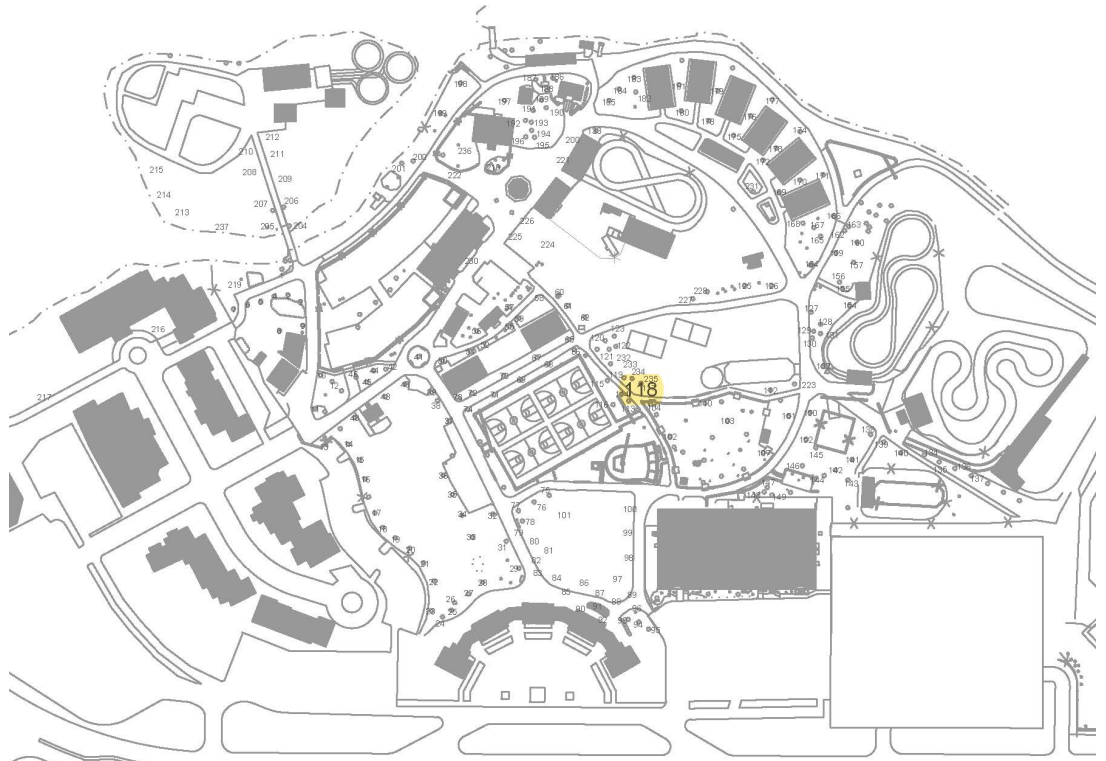

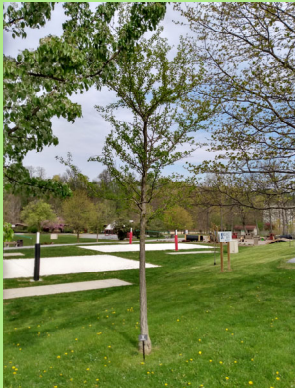
