Massachusetts to Wisconsin, south to Florida and Mississippi

The Tulip Tree is a fast-growing, large deciduous tree with a medium texture. Habit is oval-rounded. Distinct 'tulip' shaped leaves are bright green and large, turning yellow in Fall. Large yellow-green flowers appear in late Spring. Bark is gray-brown and furrowed. Timber is used for furniture and other finished items.

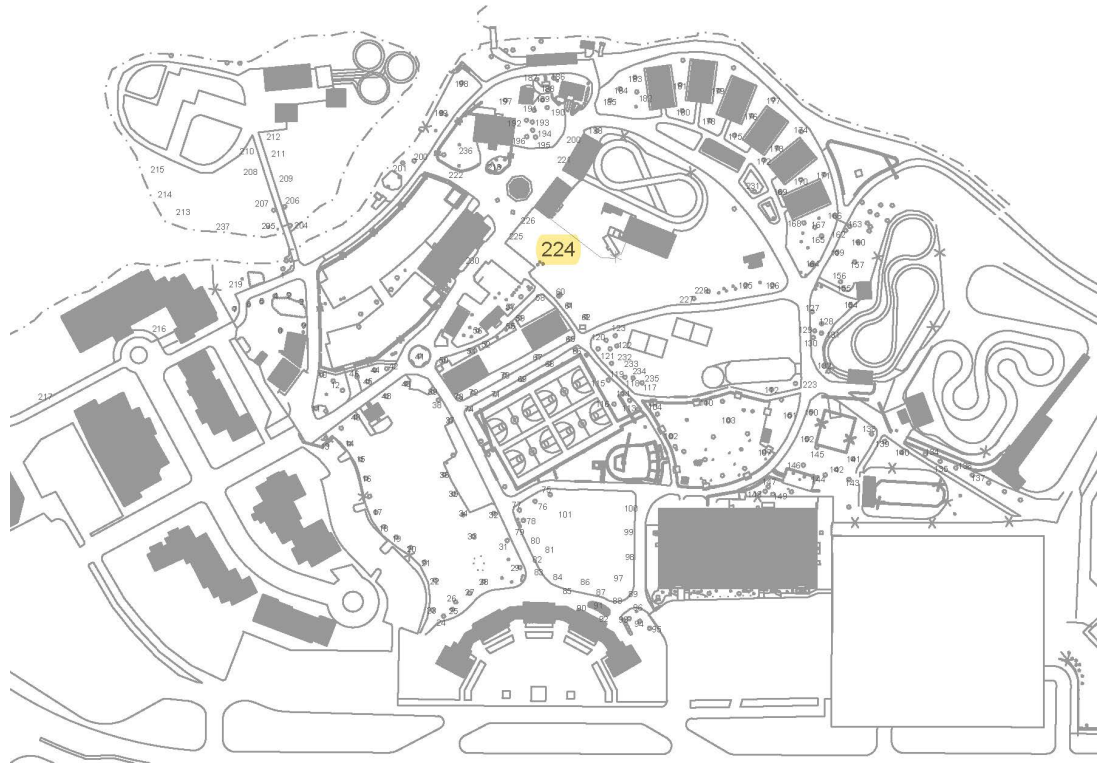
