The Douglas Fir is a short-needled evergreen, with 2 white bands on the underside. Habit is openly-pyramidal, losing lower branches with age. Cones are 4" long and 2" wide. The strong wood has been used for structural timbers. Good needle retention also makes it a popular Christmas tree.

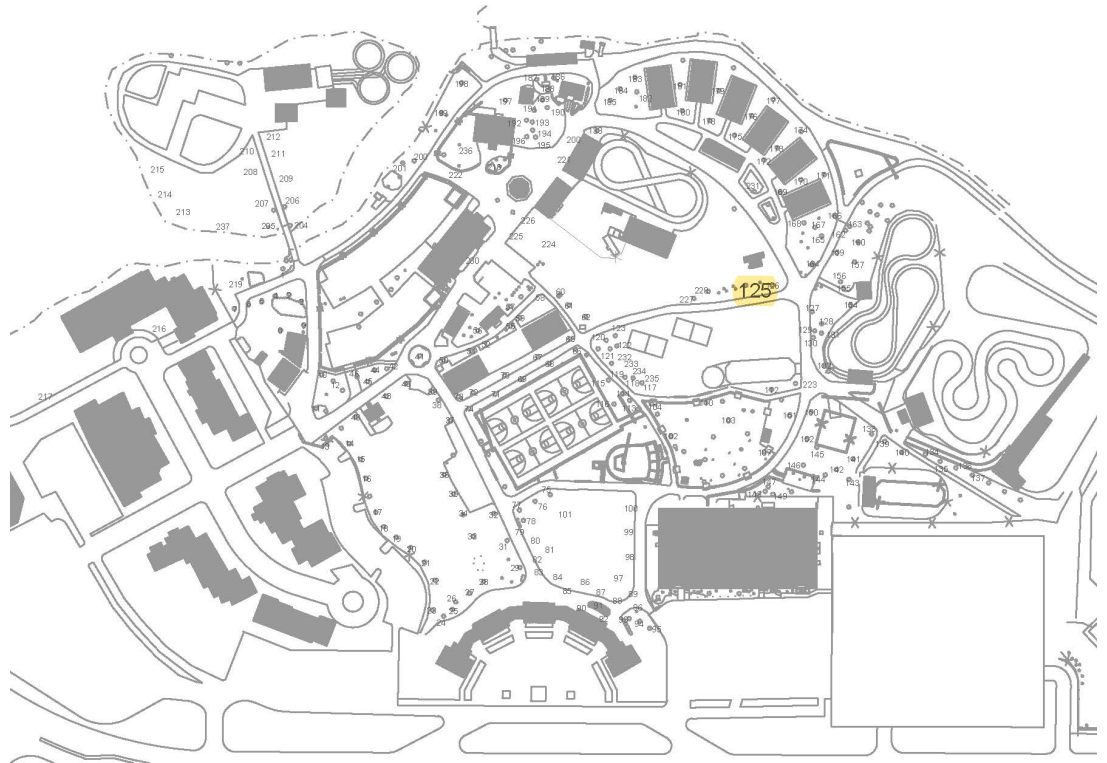
