



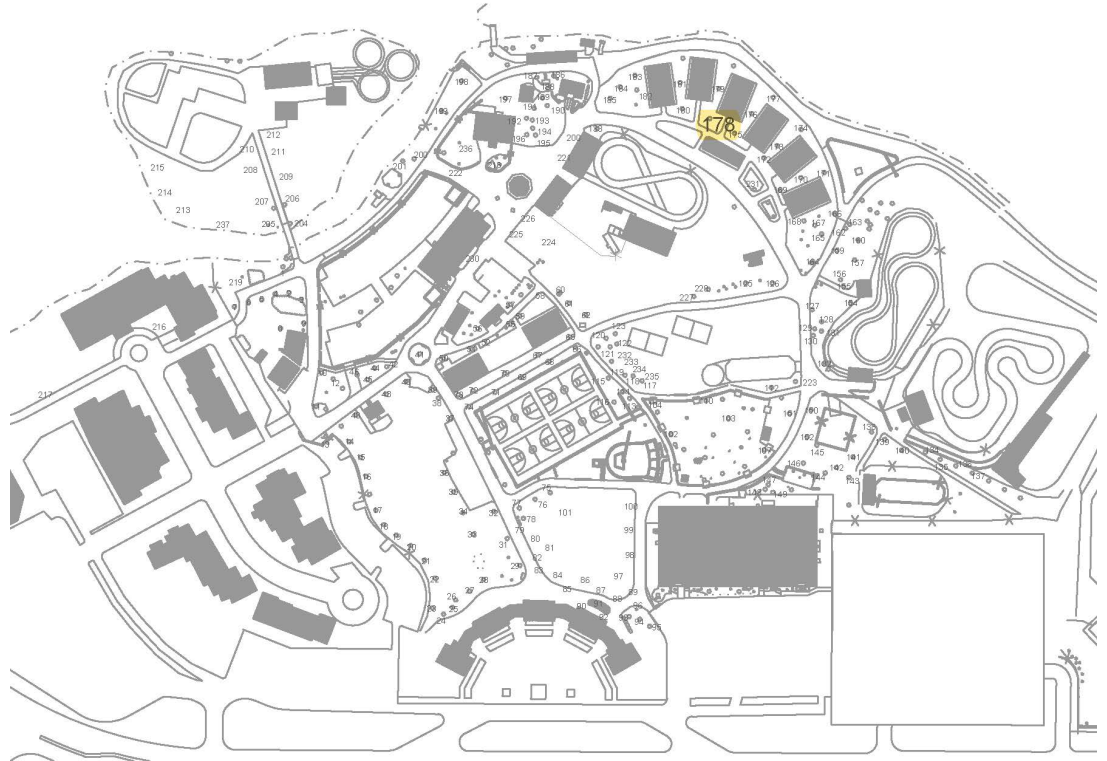

The Sawtooth Oak is a dense, pyramidal tree when young that becomes more rounded with age. The leaves are oblong, with a serrated edge that inspires the common name. The bark is deeply furrowed. Dark green leaves turn yellow-brown in Fall. Spring catkins are followed by 3/4" acorns in Fall.
