



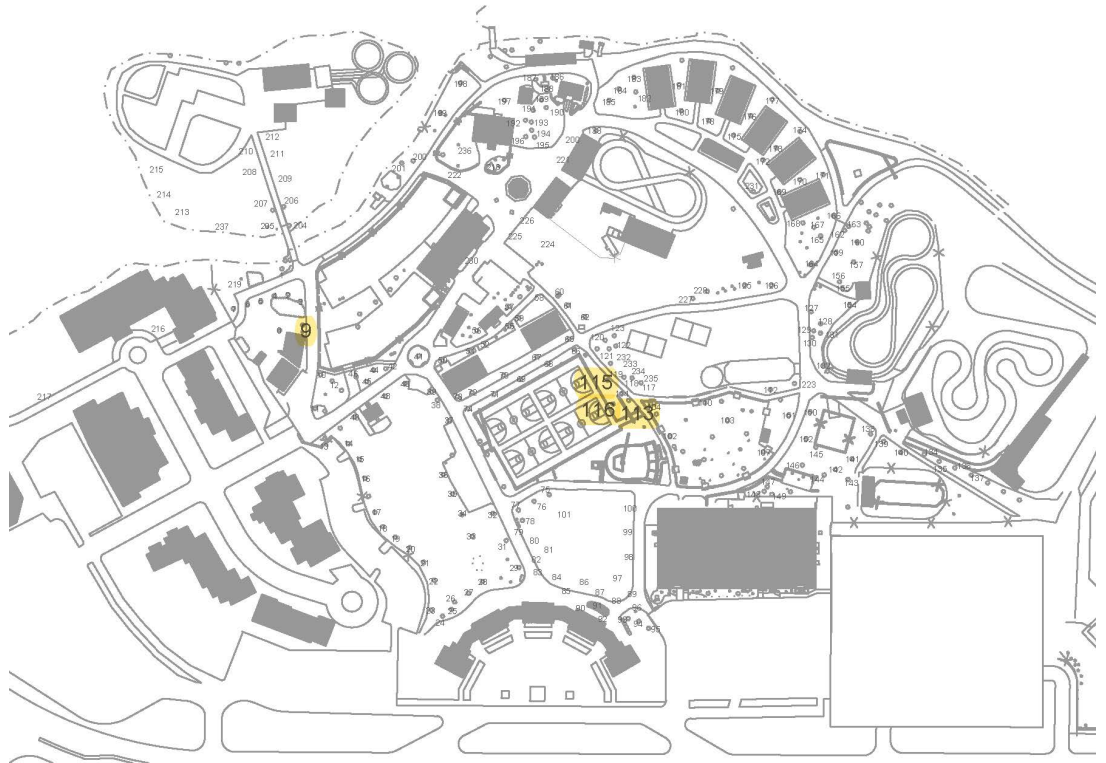

The Chestnut Oak's habit is rounded and dense. Leaves are oval with coarse, regular teeth. In Fall, the leaves turn yellow-brown. The 1" sweet acorns are a particularly attractive food source for wildlife. Bark is dark brown and deeply-furrowed.
