The English Oak is a long-lived deciduous tree with a broadly-rounded to spreading habit and a short trunk. The gray-black bark is deeply-furrowed. Dark green leaves have rounded lobes and turn brown in Fall. The 1" elongated acorns are a valuable food source for several small mammals and some birds, but trees may take up to 20 years to produce fruit.

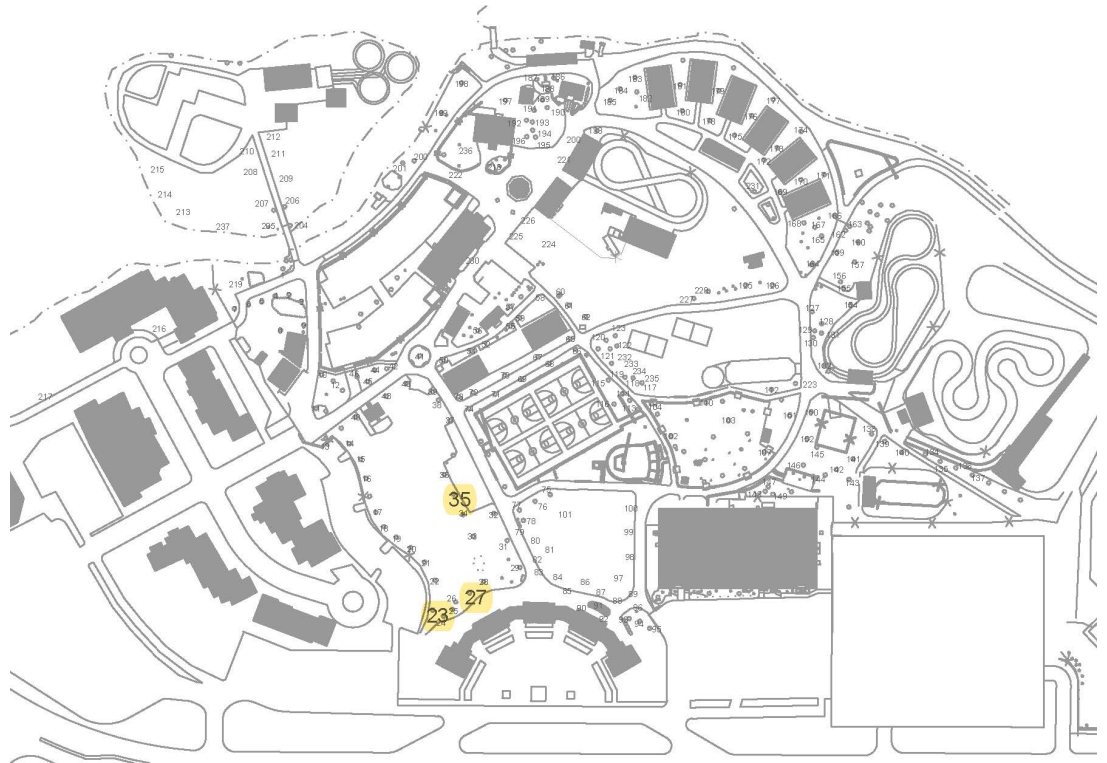
