



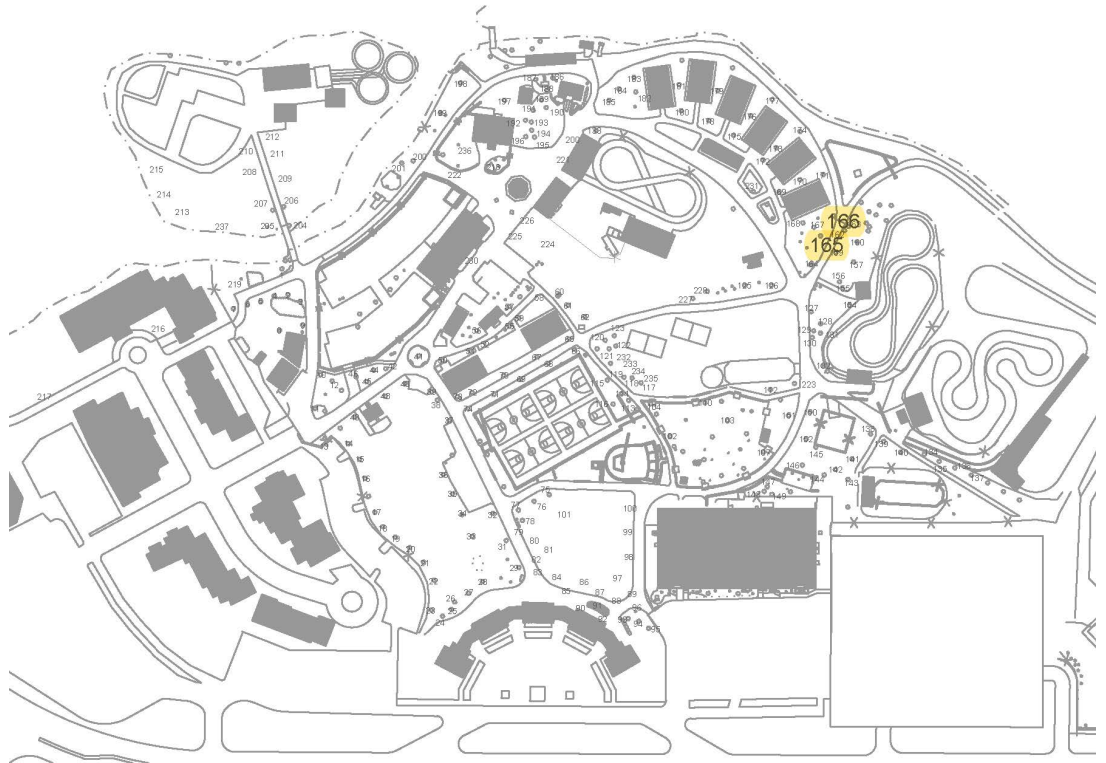

Canada to Virginia and Alabama, west to North Dakota, Kansas and Texas
The American Linden is a large tree with low-spreading branches and a rounded crown when mature. Bark is gray-brown with long, narrow ridges. Heart-shaped, dark green leaves have a fine-toothed edge and turn yellow-brown in Fall. Small, fragrant, yellow flowers in early Summer are highly-attractive to bees. The fruit is a small nutlet produced in late Summer. The wood is lightweight and can be used for furniture and veneer.
