The Silver Linden is a pyramidal, deciduous tree that opens slightly with age. Bark is light gray and smooth when young, becoming more furrowed with age. Heart-shaped, dark green leaves with a silvery underside have a fine-toothed edge and turn yellow-brown in Fall. Small, fragrant, yellow flowers in Summer are highly-attractive to bees. The fruit is a small nutlet produced in late Summer.

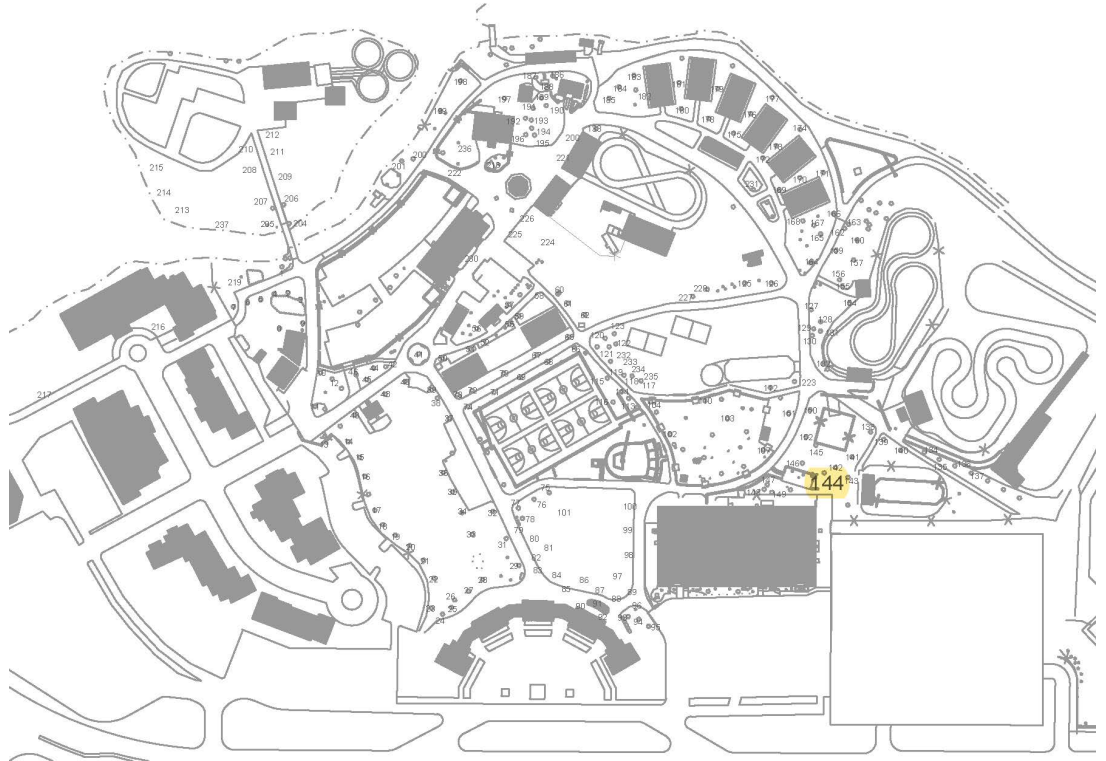
