The Eastern Hemlock is a fine-textured conifer. Habit is pyramidal when young, with branches becoming more pendulous with age. Needles are dark green, short and soft, with two white bands on the underside. Cones are small and slender. The bark is cinnamon-red and furrowed.

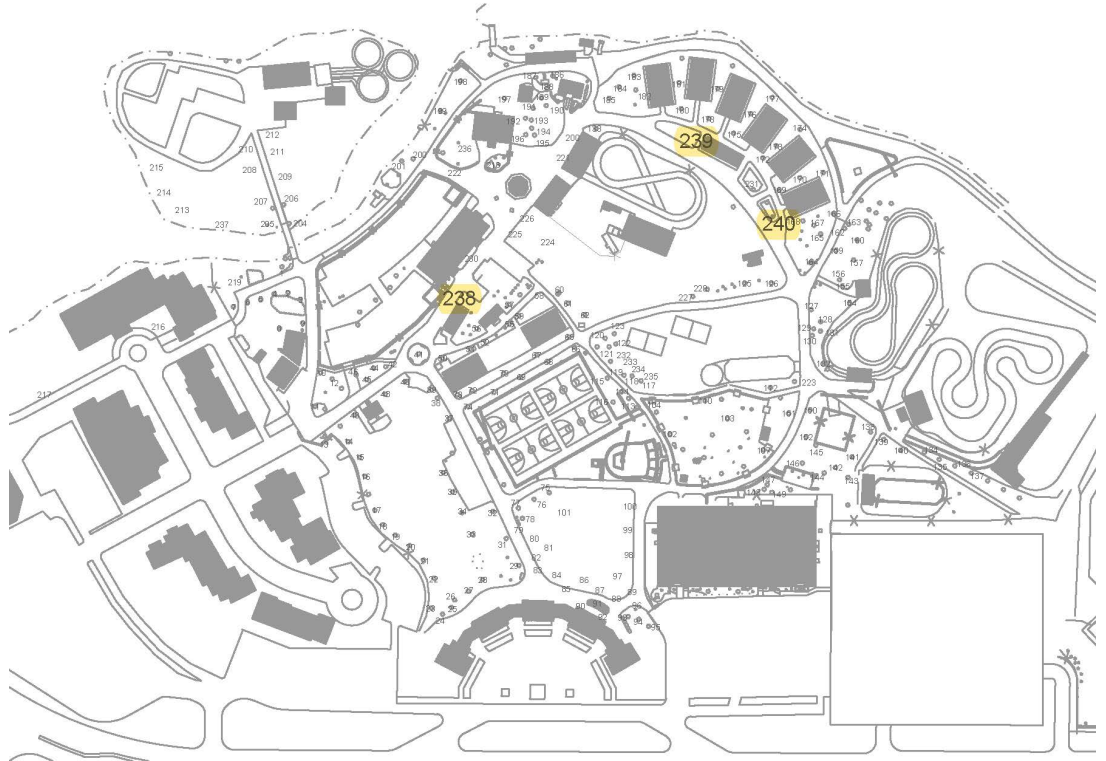
